Then the Jesuits refused burial in consecrated ground to a woman and the people forcibly buried her. Fr Chianelli and Antillich were had up before the magistrate. One of the schools has been moved and is no longer Catholic but Wesleyan. He depicts general struggles with the Anglicans. Fr Parisi was accused of marrying a couple without bans. Fr Antillich was almost put in jail for contempt of court. The schools inspector fined a school but this was dismissed. He mentions the letter to Lord Kimberly. There is a determination to expel the Jesuits from Conzal and possibly elsewhere. 26 Sep: They need another English priest. The request for a Catholic section in the burial ground is under consideration. The letter denouncing Fr Antillich will not appear as the newspaper refused to print it. The Wesleyan schoolmaster was given a certificate immediately while the Jesuit had to wait, even though he had taught before. The rival school did not last. They can't get a servant boy, whereas previously it would have been easy, even without pay. 22 Sep: Anselm is not coming this year. He is worried about the appointment of a new magistrate. The law preventing children moving schools without a certificate is invoked against the Jesuit schools, but their appeals for its use against other schools are dismissed. He includes some smaller notes to other correspondants at the end of his letter.
